Henry Fielding: Henry Fielding, novelist and playwright, who, with Samuel Richardson, is considered a founder of the English novel. Among his major novels are *Joseph Andrews* (1742) and *Tom Jones* (1749). Fielding was born of a family that by tradition traced its descent to a branch of the Habsburgs. The 1st earl of Sarah Fielding (8 November 1710 – 9 April 1768) was an English author and sister of the novelist Henry Fielding. She wrote *The Governess, or The Little Female Academy* (1749), the first novel in English aimed specifically at children. Jean Sibelius (1865 - 1957), quoted in Bengt de Torne "Sibelius: A Close-Up" 1937 Against criticism a man can neither protest nor defend himself; he must act in spite of it, and then it will gradually yield to him. *Joseph Andrews*: *Joseph Andrews*, novel by Henry Fielding, published in 1742. It was written as a reaction against Samuel Richardson's novel *Pamela; or, Virtue Rewarded* (1740). Fielding portrayed Joseph Andrews as the brother of Pamela Andrews, the heroine of Richardson's novel. Described on the title page as
